SYLLABUS

Pre Bun (Pre Beginner) Premiership (3, 4 & 5 years only)

Any two Bun (beginner) grade light dances. 32 bars only. Same dance can be repeated.

Bun (Beginner) Premierships

Any two Bun (beginner) grade light dances. Two different dances required. Two different dances required.

Tus (Primary) Premierships

Any two Tus (primary) dances.

Black Out Premiership (Mean and Ard grade)

Choice Reel or Slip Jig, Choice Jig or Hornpipe (32

bars)

Adult Premiership

Any two Bun (beginner) grade light dances.

- Pre Bun: For dancers aged 3, 4 or 5 on January 1st 2023
- Black Out: Dancers must wear black apparel. See rules for costume clarification.
- Adult: For dancers over the age of 18 years who did not take Irish dance classes as a juvenile
- All speeds are as per AIDA Inc grading rules.
- Competitors will be required to confirm which dances they will competing with in the premierships at the time of entry.

RULES OF THE 2023 MCALEER OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP

This Championship is conducted under the Rules and Regulations of An Coimisiun le Rince Gaelacha and the Australian Irish Dancing Association Inc. (AIDA Inc.)

LODGEMENT OF ENTRIES

- ENTRIES CLOSE 10:00PM FRIDAY MAY 12TH 2023
- All competitors must be entered online via https://www.trybooking.com/CHERK
- Entries received after the due date will be treated as late for 7 days only, and will be charged a late fee of double the total entry fee. Entries cannot be accepted after May 19th, 2023

PRELIMINARY CHAMPIONSHIPS - RULES AND DIRECTIVES

- 1. Preliminary Championships will be offered in the girls sections from 9 Years of age on January 1st 2023
- 2. Preliminary Championship will be danced as part of the Open Championship.
- 3. Entry to the Preliminary Championships will be restricted to the following -
- Dancers who have never won an Open Championship
- Dancers who did not attain a top ten position at a National Championships for 2022
- 4. Preliminary Championship result would be calculated on the first 2 rounds of the Open Championship only, awarding top five with a prize ratio of 1:2 thereafter e.g. if there were 10 Prelim. entries in the Under 12s Girls, only 5 Places for Preliminary Championships would be awarded.
- 5. Dancers cannot enter the Preliminary Championship unless they have entered the Open Championships in the same age group.

AGE LIMITS

• The age of a competitor shall be taken as on 1st January 2023. Where a competitor's birth date falls on 1st January he/she shall, for the McAleer Championship be regarded as under the age attained on that day.

PRIZES

- In all Championship sections, all dancers will be recalled and in sections with 11 or more dancers, 60% of those dancers will receive a placing, whilst the remaining 40% will receive a Championship award.
- In all Premierships sections, 60% of dancers will be placed in every section.

 Dancers with 5 or less competitors will all be placed.
- Premierships with 3 or less competitors may be combined with another age group.
 This does not apply to Pre Bun premierships.

BLACK OUT PREMIERSHIPS

- The Black Out Premierships will take place on Sunday June 11th. Competitors are only permitted to wear black out dance attire: Black dresses, black skirt and seperate body suit, black t-shirt, black pants, black shirts.
- Please note the following: When wearing body suits with skirts (commonly known as black-out attire) black tights (of a denier (not) less than 70) must be worn from the age of 14 and above. Effective date: 1st February, 2020.

- Parents are responsible for their children's behaviour both within and outside the venue.
- No food or drink is to be consumed in the main area of the theatre, UNLESS OTHERWISE ADVISED
- Smoking is not permitted within any part of the premises.
- No hairspray or aerosol sprays are to be used in the main area of the hall or foyer.
- Competitors must be pupils of registered teachers with An Comisium Le Rinci Gaelacha.
 Dancers who are
- Residents in Australia are required to be registered with AIDA Inc. for the current year.
- Entries should be submitted using the TryBooking link on the syllabus.
- Entry fees will be refunded if insufficient numbers are received.
- All competitors must be ready to commence their section at least 30 minutes prior to the scheduled start time. The Feis organizing committee reserves the right to commence sections up to 30 minutes prior to the advertised start time.
- It is the competitors' responsibility to be in the marshalling area when called, otherwise, they may miss their section.
- The McAleer Championship Committee reserves the right to amend the order of dancers at any time.
- If a dancer loses a heel or complete shoe, he/she may stand back allowing the other dancer to continue dancing uninhibited. Such a dancer will then be allowed to re-dance.
- If a dancer falls the adjudicator must ring the bell. The dancer will be permitted to re-dance at the adjudicator's discretion.
- Should a dancer bump or slip, they may be allowed to re-dance at the adjudicator's discretion.

STEPS

- Reel The lead around may be danced on the right foot twice or on the right and left foot. The
 two steps following the lead must be performed on the right and left foot.
- Slip Jig The lead around may be danced on the right foot twice or on the right and left foot.
 The first step must be performed on the right and left foot. The last step will be performed on the right foot only.
- Treble Jig The lead around and the following two steps must be performed on the right and left foot. Hornpipe - The lead around and the first step must be performed on the right and left foot. The last step will be performed on the right foot only. NOTE: Where a dancer is required to perform a step on the right and left foot, ALL movements in the first 8 bars must be replicated on the opposite foot in the second 8 bars.
- In graded sections, competitors are required to perform the correct standard of work as set out in the AIDA Inc. Competition Rules and Regulations. Competitors will be disqualified by adjudicators if an incorrect standard of work is performed.
- No block, over toe, en point movement, stationary or moving is allowed to be performed in any age group up to and including the 11 years.

- Make-Up and Fake Tanning will not be permitted for any dancers in Novice, Pre-Bun, Bun or Tus for 11 years and under.
- Facial make-up is not permitted for any dancer, in any grade, under the age of 10 years.
- Competitors in Pre-Bun, Bun or Tus Grad, up to and including 11 years, may only wear traditional class costumes or long/short-sleeved blouses/shirts & skirts/trousers, polo tops & skirts/trousers, body suits & skirts or tunics that conform to the regular costume length rule. Low-cut tops and short tight skirts are not permitted.
- The length of costumes must adhere to principles of modesty and enable dancers to safely execute their movements and steps. Adjudicators who determine a costume to be too short or to lack modesty may ask a competitor to change into black tights (of a denier not less than 70 percent) in order for the dancer to continue in the competition.
- Necklines must be at collarbone level or above. This does not preclude the use of alternative fabrics, e.g., lace, as an inset. Costumes must consist of full front, side, and back sections. Cut-away styles, without a full skirt backing, are not acceptable.
- In order to protect dancers from hazardous objects on stage while competing, costumes may not be decorated with feathers.
- Appropriate underwear must be worn. Where tights are worn, they must be of a denier not less than 70.
- The use of artificial arm/carriage aids is not permitted. Any competitor found to be using artificial carriage aids, and subsequently refuses to remove same, will be subject to disqualification from that particular competition. Medically prescribed apparatus (proof of which may be required) will be exempt from this ruling.
- To receive prizes or awards, competitors must be in full dancing costume including shoes.
- Dancers are reminded to wear appropriate dress at all times whilst at the Feis (especially in the Hall/Auditorium area).
- Tracksuit pants/shorts & tops must be worn whilst practicing, warming up, or not in
- costume. The wearing of only leotards/bloomers when not in costume is not considered suitable attire.
- All dancers must change in the dressing rooms.
- Any form of unauthorized photography which has the capability to capture a dancer's image whilst in motion, using electronic or manual means e.g., mobile phones, standard cameras, video camcorder, commercial film with or without flash enhancements is expressly forbidden (unless prior permission has been given by the Feis organizers).
 Photography of presentations is permitted.
- For dancers in the Novice, Pre-Bun and Bun sections, refer to the PHOTOGRAPHY CONDITIONS, as listed below.
- Competitors enter at their own risk regarding injury. The McAleer Open Championship. will not accept any liability for injuries sustained. Lodgement of an entry will be deemed to be an acceptance of this provision by a dancer.
- Lodgement of an entry shall be taken to signify that the Teacher, Parents and Pupils concerned accept these rules in full and agree to strictly abide by them.

*PHOTOGRAPHY CONDITIONS FOR PRE BUN AND BUN DANCERS

Following recent changes made to the photography rules set down by An Comisium Le Rinci Gaelacha, Ireland, families will now be given the opportunity to film their children dancing in **PRE BUN AND BUN SECTIONS ONLY** under the guidelines set out below.

- Who Only persons known to the Dancer may be photographers. There may only be one photographer per dancer per dance. Photography of any other Dancer is NOT Permitted
- What Video and still Photo images only. NO FLASH Photography permitted. If the same Dancer who competes in Novice/Bun also competes in a higher Grade, photography in not allowed in the higher Grade event under any circumstances
- Where Photographers will only be permitted to take photographic images from a designated area/s assigned by the Feis Organizers. Prize presentation photography is permitted and is not limited to the designated photography area
- When Only during the time of the actual performance of the particular Dancer on stage. Any other photography at the Feis, e.g. outside the Feis venue or during warm up, is by the express permission of the Dancers and /or their guardians only
